<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Please make a 60 second video entitled 'What makes my heart sing'</p> <p>This does not need to be a high quality production in any way. It can just be made on your phone.</p> <p>What we want to find out is what makes you tick as a person, and why you'd be perfect for these roles. (You may want to be creative, or just talk to the camera, it's entirely up to you).</p>
